## Clarification of new rule regarding Stallion Re-certification

If a stallion owner does not pay the annual recertification fee in a given year, his status as a Registered Arkansas Stallion ceases.

If a stallion owner does not pay the annual re-certification fee in a given year, stallion awards will not be paid on foals produced from the breedings that year or in subsequent years.

If a stallion owner does not pay the annual recertification fee, foals of mares

bred to that stallion will be considered bred to a non-registered Arkansas stallion. This will not effect the eligibility of the foal being registered as a Registered Arkansas-bred thoroughbred as long as the mare is bred back the same calendar year the foal is foaled to an Arkansas registered stallion only, or if the mare is not bred at all during the calendar year the foal is foaled, she must be bred to an Arkansas registered stallion only the following year.

**THE JOCKEY CLUB** encourages use of the Jockey Club Interactive Registry. Submit your live foal reports on line. It's so easy. Jockey Club Rules regarding Live Foal/No Foal reports state:

**Live Foal/No Foal Report (LF/NF).** "Within 30 days of the birth of a foal, the owner, breeder or authorized agent must complete a Live Foal/No Foal Report. The LF/NF indicates the exact date of foaling, the sex of the foal and the state or Canadian province where the foal was born. It is at this stage of the registration process, that the breeder of the foal and correct address for receiving correspondence and the Certificate of Foal Registration must be supplied. In the event the breeding did not result in pregnancy or the pregnancy was lost during gestation, a No Foal Report should be completed and submitted to The Jockey Club as soon as possible.

## 2014 RESTRICTED ARKANSAS-BRED STAKES RACES AT OAKLAWN PARK

Five Stakes races, restricted to registered Arkansas-breds, will run at Oaklawn's 2014 live meet. Each race will have a \$75,000 guaranteed purse. The races and dates are as follows:

**THE DOWNTHE DUSTY ROAD STAKES (5th Running)** for fillies and mares, 3 year olds and up at a distance of 6 furlongs will run Saturday, March 1, 2014.

**THE NODOUBLE BREEDERS' STAKES (5th Running)** for colts and geldings, 3 year olds and up at a distance of 6 furlongs will run Saturday, March 1, 2014.

**THE ARKANSAS BREEDERS' STAKES (Open) (4th Running)\*** for three-year-olds and up at a distance of 1 1/16 mile will run Friday, March 28, 2014.

**The RAINBOW MISS STAKES (35th Running)** for three year old fillies and mares at a distance of 6 furlongs will run Saturday, March 29, 2014.

**THE RAINBOW STAKES (40th Running)** for three year old colts and geldings at a distance of 6 furlongs will run Sunday, March 30, 2014.

\*Fillies receive a 5# weight allowance - Above races will have a \$75,000 guaranteed purse. Each race will have a sustaining nomination date (NO FEE DUE).

### MINUTES OF MEETINGS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF ARKANSAS THOROUGHBRED BREEDERS' & HORSEMEN'S ASSOCIATION

A meeting of the Board of Directors of Arkansas Thoroughbred Breeders' & Horsemen's Association was held Tuesday, June 25, 2013 at 1:00 p.m. at the ATBHA office located at 161 Golf Links Road, Hot Springs, Arkansas.

President McDowell called the meeting to order. The roll was called. In attendance were Bill McDowell, Tommy Ives, Linda Anderson, Jesse Clement, Tim Martin, Lewis Mathews, Jr., Libbie Thiel, Susan Watkins, David Whited and Val Yagos. Not present was Stanley, who is recuperating from an injury he sustained in the paddock at Louisiana Downs.

President McDowell asked if there were any corrections or discussion regarding the Minutes from the May 14, 2013 meeting of the ATBHA Board of Directors, there being none, Val Yagos made a motion to accept the Minutes as presented, seconded by Linda Anderson and unanimously approved.

Next was in-depth discussion regarding the 2014 stakes races at Oaklawn including the recent notification received from The Jockey Club that the Arkansas Breeders' Stakes (Female Division) had lost black type eligibility. After discussion; Tommy Ives made a Motion, seconded by Susan Watkins, that the female division of the Arkansas Breeders' Stakes be discontinued for 2014 and that the remaining restricted stakes races run as in the past and have a purse of \$75,000 beginning in 2014. A vote was taken and the Motion passed unanimously.

President McDowell then announced that Oaklawn had notified us that they would be tearing down the structure that houses the ATBHA office in the near future. They have designated a site in line with the existing chain link fence on the right as you enter the backside stable area through the stable gate for a new building that they suggest we obtain, manufactured or modular, which can be moved on to the designated site or built, if desired, on the designated site, as long as the building is able to be relocated if it ever becomes necessary. Additionally, all aspects of the building must meet the space requirements and all state and city codes, as discussed. The directors were further informed that Oaklawn had pointed out that all utilities were already in the immediate area where the building will be located. Directors having any connections for bids on such a building were asked to notify the ATBHA office. We are hoping to be able to relocate, move in and be settled by 9/30/13, if at all possible.

There being no further business, Motion made by Susan Watkins, seconded by Tommy Ives, and unanimously approved, the meeting was adjourned.

The Arkansas Thoroughbred Breeders' & Horsemen's Association requires all stallion owners or breeding farms to file a COPY of the 2013 Report of Mares Bred with their office with a check for \$300 in payment of the 2013 Stallion Re-Certification fee.

If you have not filed this report and paid this fee, please do so immediately.

**A COPY** should be mailed to **A.T.B.H.A.**  
**WITH the \$300.00 annual Re-certification Fee.**

If the Stallion's Re-certification Fee is not paid, your stallion loses it's Registered Arkansas Stallion status and all mares bred to him that year are considered bred to a non-registered stallion.

Subsequent foals from that and future breeding seasons can be Registered Arkansas-breds **IF** all applicable conditions regarding foals sired by a non-registered or out-of-state stallion are met (See **Section I. Eligible Foals (1) (b)**).

If you have ANY questions concerning this new rule, please contact the ATBHA office.

## ATTENTION OWNERS of Registered Arkansas-breds of Racing Age NEW RULE Effective 2014!!!!

The Stewards at Oaklawn Jockey are writing a rule to be effective in 2014 regarding Arkansas-bred horses. Basically, it will say: It is the **Owner's** responsibility, not the trainer's, to have proof of registration as an Arkansas-bred affixed to The Jockey Club Certificate of a registered Arkansas-bred foal. The Jockey Club Certificate **MUST BE** stamped and signed by an authorized representative of A.T.B.H.A., **or** the yellow copy of the Arkansas-bred Foal Registration Certificate, issued by A.T.B.H.A., **MUST BE** attached to the top corner of the back of the certificate. Either of the above two forms of proof of registration **MUST BE** accomplished.

Effective in 2014 registered Arkansas-breds **WILL NOT** be allowed to run at Oaklawn Park without one of the above described forms of proof of registration affixed to The Jockey Club Certificate of the horse. The owner must make sure this is taken care of **PRIOR TO** the papers being delivered to a trainer.

Failure to adhere to the above rule could cause you to lose your date of entry at the racing office if the papers have to be pulled and taken to the A.T.B.H.A. for stamping and/or cause your horse to be ineligible to race.

The Arkansas-bred Foal Registration Certificate is mailed to the person who submits the Application for Registration of the foal to A.T.B.H.A., usually on or before Dec. 31 of the weaning year.

## Learning from a Man in a League of His Own

Taken in part from *Texarkana Gazette* article written by Jim Williamson

Jim Morgan was an 18-year-old "black kid" playing on an all white minor league baseball team in Durham, N.C., Bulls.

It was the baseball season of 1963 in the middle of integration throughout the south.

Walter Ray Matthews was a 28-year-old white player and coach on the same Durham, N.C. team

Matthews was a native of Little River County, Arkansas., and grew up in a community called "Hicks." In the off-season Matthews still lived east of Wilton, Ark., in Little River County near the Hicks community.

At 6 feet 3 inches, Matthews had the swagger of movie star John Wayne.

The year was full of paradoxes.

During the Civil Rights Movement in 1963, four black children were killed in the Birmingham, Ala., church bombing and 250,000 civil right protesters marched in Washington, D.C.

NAACP leader Medgar Evers was also assassinated in 1963 and on November 22, 1963 President John F. Kennedy was also assassinated.

The Durham fans appreciated the play of Joe Morgan, but the fans of rival teams tossed racial slurs and threats to Morgan during the baseball season of 1963.

He wanted to quit the team and reached the point he was packing his equipment in the locker room, crying with frustration and anger.

"Joe was going to quit baseball. Joe was a little black kid from California, and he wasn't used to segregation. All North Carolina had were those tobacco farmers, and they were tough old rascals," said Matthews, who is a scout for the Houston Astros at age 77.

"I go in the locker room one afternoon after practice and before th game. He (Morgan was crying and packing up his clothes. He couldn't stand all of that. He was going home," Matthews said.

"I sat him down and told him, "They're not going to bother you. I will make sure of that." They were all my buddies, and I knew all of those tobacco farmers. They were the same thing as the cotton farmers in Southwest Arkansas," he said.

"They left him alone. He went on and played. Now he is in the Hall of Fame and played on two world championship teams," Matthews said. Morgan remembers the racism in 1963 and appreciates the support of Matthews and his Durham teammates. The fans supported Morgan after he hit a homerun to tie a game in the ninth inning during the season of 1963. "Walt stood out the most during that time. He was kinda like a rock. He played hard every day and knew how to play. As a young player, I wanted to be like Walt," Morgan said in a telephone interview.

"he was always there for me. He talked to me and always taught me to do things the right way. I found out later he talked to some of those people. He was one of the most popular players. "Walt was just like John Wayne. He was a man's man. He had a walk and he helped everybody," Morgan said. "He taught us how to stand up to opposition. In baseball, there is a lot of razzing and yelling. If they hit one of our guys or knocked down one of our players on the field, Walt would lead the charge to retaliate," he said.

"He also learned how to be a professional from Matthews. "He taught me how to carry myself. When things are not going well, he got a little tougher. I like to think he rubbed off on me,"

Morgan said. White the Durham fans supported Morgan, after 50 years he vividly remembers how African-Americans were treated at baseball fields, particularly in Winston-Salem.

"All the black people had to sit in right field behind chicken wire. I've always had that image in my mind of African-Americans cooped up behind the chicken wire in right field," he said.

Morgan started his baseball career Modesto, California. The ball park was 90 minutes from his house. "I grew up in Oakland, CA and it was a diverse city. A lot of my friends growing up were Caucasian," Morgan said. Then he was sent to North Carolina. I was not used to being the only African-American on the team. I would walk up to the plate, and obviously a lot happened. Not in Durham, but when we went on the road," he said. "I couldn't stay with the team on the road. The team would be in a hotel with air conditioning. I couldn't eat with the team. I had to stay in motels with no air conditioning in the African-American part of town," Morgan said. "Things have improved in the last 50 years. But, then I was the guy in the spotlight, and I was the guy who needed assistance from Walt to keep going," he said. Walt was there for me during my darkest moments. An 18-year-old will remember who stood up for you. Walt stood up for me. "I wanted to quit. Make no mistake; I felt sorry for myself. I had that image in my mind of all the African-Americans cooped up behind the screen in right field. It was a terrible part of our country's history. But I know the people in right field had it rougher than I did," he said.

If Morgan quit he would have to face Matthews, but, more importantly, he would have to face his father, Leonard, who fought with the U.S. Army in World War II. "My dad was a leader of African-American squads in World War II and he had gone to college. He had to put up with things worse than I did. I kept thinking, "How would I tell my father I quit." He had fought in World War II, and he did it for his family and the country," Morgan said.

"You never forget people who have an impact on your life. A lot of things could have gone differently in Durham without Walt. When I made it to the major leagues, Walt was still a part of me."

Because of the impact and persistence Walt Matthews had on the career and life of Jim Morgan, his major league career includes:

- \* Two World series championships with the Cincinnati Reds in 1975 and 1976.

- \* He drove in Ken Griffey for the winning run in game seven of the 1975 World Series.

- \* Eight consecutive All-Star game appearances from 1972-1979.

- \* All-Star appearances in 1966 and 1970 with the Houston Astros.

- \* National League Most Valuable Player in 1975 and 1976.

He was the first second baseman in the history of the National League to win the MVP back to back.

- \* Golden Glove Award in consecutive years from 1973 to 1977.

- \* Featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated April 12, 1976.

- \* Inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1990.

- \* Baseball broadcaster for ESPN and host of nationally syndicated radio show for Sports USA.

- \* Currently a special adviser for the Cincinnati Reds.

Jim Morgan obviously credits Walt Matthews for playing a huge part in making him the man he grew up to be ... He wasn't a quitter ... he was a star ... a true baseball legend!
