TRPB TO INTRODUCE DIGITAL TATTOO

The Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau (TRPB), an investigative agency formed in 1946 by the Thoroughbred Racing Associations of North America to protect the integrity of the sport, has announced the introduction of the digital tattoo system, scheduled for full implementation by January 1, 2020.

The announcement was made by J. Curtis Linnell, executive vice president of the TRPB.

The TRPB provides authentication of identity for every Thoroughbred racing in the United States and Canada.

The Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) passed a model rule regarding digital tattoos this past summer. The model rule states, effective by January 1, 2020, the racing secretary shall ensure that the registration certificates for all Thoroughbred horses

ATBHA RULES AND REGISTRATION CHANGES

The ATBHA Board of Directors recently reviewed the Rules & Regulations of Arkansas Thoroughbred Breeders' & Horsemen's Association, specifically rules governing registration of Stallions, Broodmares and Foals in Arkansas. At their last meeting suggested changes were discussed, voted on and approved for presentation to the Arkansas Racing Commission as is required by law. At the September meeting of the ARC, the rules with proposed changes were approved and became effective immediately.

Only minor grammatical and punctuation changes were made to the Stallion and Foal Registration Applications; no changes to the substance of the rules.

The Broodmare Registration rules with approved changes are:

III. BROODMARE REGISTRATION.

A. A broodmare in foal by a stallion not registered as an Arkansas Stallion who is brought into Arkansas for the purpose of foaling and registering her foal as a Registered Arkansas-bred must be reported by the broodmare owner or agent at the time of her arrival in Arkansas prior to foaling by completing and filing an Application for Registration of Broodmare with ATBHA, accompanied by a copy of the broodmare's Jockey Club Certificate of Foal Registration, including the section showing ownership transfers, and payment of broodmare registration fee together with current ATBHA membership dues, if not previously paid.

B. In order for a mare to be registered with ATBHA as a "registered Arkansas thoroughbred broodmare", her registration with ATBHA must be accomplished (1) as stated in section III. A. above, or (2) If section III. A. above is not applicable, prior to foaling the foal for which the registration as an "Arkansas-bred thoroughbred horse" is sought.

C. To register a broodmare as a "registered Arkansas-bred thoroughbred broodmare" an Application for Registration of Broodmare must be completed and filed with ATBHA prior to foaling, accompanied by a copy of the broodmare's Jockey Club Certificate of Foal Registration, including the section showing

ownership transfers, and payment of broodmare registration fee together with current ATBHA membership dues, if not previously paid.

D. A broodmare will remain registered and her owner shall be entitled to Breeder's Awards based on the earnings of her registered Arkansas-bred progeny until said broodmare changes ownership. If a broodmare is sold or otherwise changes ownership, the new owner must re-register said broodmare into his/her name prior to foaling in order for that broodmare's registration status to remain uninterrupted and to be entitled to Breeder's Awards based on the earnings of her registered Arkansas-bred progeny foaled during his ownership.

It is imperative that broodmares coming into the State of Arkansas be registered when the mare is brought into the state, prior to the foal being born.

Registration Applications are available on the ATBHA web-site.

The applicable rules for each type of registration (Stallion, Broodmare and/or Foal) will print on the back of the actual registration form itself. The complete set of rules "Arkansas Thoroughbred Breeders' & Horsemen's Association Rules & Regulations" are on the ATBHA website, atbha.com.

If at any time anyone has a question regarding a registration or registration rule they can contact the ATBHA office by email, through the ATBHA website, by fax, by phone or by mail for clarification and/or verification.

The ATBHA rules and changes will be strictly enforced and followed. Failure to comply may cause a registration to be ineligible, VOID or late, costing additional fees.

The Jockey Club Reminds Foal Certificate Managers to Sign Up for Interactive Registration Accounts

As the end of the year approaches, The Jockey Club reminds owners, breeders, and agents who handle foal certificates that an Interactive Registration (IR) account is required for those who manage and transfer digital foal certificates. Starting with the 2018 foal crop, The Jockey Club Registry transitioned from hardcopies of foal certificates to digital copies.

Individuals can create their IR accounts at registry.jockeyclub.com.

Through the use of digital certificates, users experience a host of benefits:

- Users can access digital certificates any time on computers and mobile devices.
- Owners and agents do not have to worry about losing or damaging certificates.
- Operations are streamlined, whether in the racing office, on the sales grounds, while transporting horses internationally, or when executing private transactions.

The registry expects that additional enhancements will be introduced in the future as various local and national racing entities incorporate their authentications to the certificate.

"Our online Interactive Registration service enables digital foal certificates to be managed and transferred to other entities in an easy and efficient manner," said Rick Bailey, registrar of The Jockey Club. "We emphasize that everyone who handles digital foal certificates must sign up for an Interactive Registration account as soon as possible if he or she has not already done so."

IR can also be used to perform nearly all registry-related activities. The Jockey Club also reminds owners that the deadline for registering yearlings and 2-year-olds is December 31, 2018.

Anyone with questions about signing up for an IR account or digital foal certificates should contact The Jockey Club Registration Services at inquiries@jockeyclub.com or (859) 224-2700.

The transition to digital foal certificates was first announced at the Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing on August 14, 2016.

MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF
ARKANSAS THOROUGHBRED BREEDERS' & HORSEMEN'S ASSOCIATION

A meeting of the Board of Directors of Arkansas Thoroughbred Breeders' & Horsemen's Association was held Wednesday, December 12, 2018 at 1:00 p.m. at the ATBHA office in Hot Springs, Arkansas.

President McDowell called the meeting to order. Directors in attendance were Bill McDowell, Lewis Mathews, Jr., Joe Benight, Jesse Clement, Tommy Ives, Sara Patterson, Jeff Sheets and Val Yagos, constituting a quorum. Not present was Ernie Witt, Linda Anderson & Tim Martin. President McDowell announced that a quorum was present.

President McDowell asked if there were any corrections or discussion regarding the Minutes from the July 31, 2018 meeting. There being none, Val Yagos made a motion to approve the minutes as written, seconded by Jeff Sheets, and unanimously approved.

President McDowell announced that the first matter to come before the Board was ATBHA registration of foals, broodmares and a stallion by Warren & Janine Winslow. After in depth discussion, a Motion was made by Tommy Ives, seconded by Joe Benight, directing a certified letter be mailed to the Winslows advising them that a review of the applications submitted by them to register seven (7) foals, nine (9) broodmares and one (1) stallion into the Arkansas program contained false or incorrect statements which disqualifies them from eligibility to participate as Registered Arkansas-bred foals, Registered Arkansas Broodmares and a Registered Arkansas stallion. The letter shall allow the Winslows the opportunity to 1) request the cancellation of the registration applications of the specified seven (7) foals, nine (9) broodmares and one (1) stallion; or 2) request a hearing to determine the eligibility of the specified horses to participate as Registered Arkansas-bred foals, Registered Arkansas broodmares and a Registered Arkansas Stallion; and, further, if no response is received from the Winslows within ten (10) days from the date of the letter, the registrations involved shall be rescinded leaving no further options or recourse by the Winslows. The motion further stated that this matter should be continued until the next meeting to allow time to receive a response from the Winslows and know the next course of action to be taken by ATBHA. A vote was taken, motion passed unanimously.

President McDowell next brought up the Bonus Purse Supplement program that we have sponsored the past couple of years for registered Arkansas-breds who run in open company races. After discussion continuance of this program for 2019 was tabled until the next meeting.

President McDowell reminded the Directors that 2019 was an election year and that they should provide an updated bio to be included with the ballot to be mailed to current members if they desired to run for re-election.

Next was the announcements that Lanny Beavers will be our guest speaker at the 2019 awards banquet and that Arkansas State University Equine program advised our office of their intention to hold a thoroughbred equine sale in the fall of 2019. After a brief discussion it was the consensus that ATBHA will support the sale and will place information about the upcoming sale in the quarterly newsletters.

There being no further business, Jesse Clement made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Joe Benight and unanimously approved.

After high school, Terry moved to Cincinnati to attend Xavier College, earning a language degree. After graduation, he spent a year in France at the Sorbonne. He got his start at River Downs in Cincinnati. Terry also announced at Ak-Sar-Ben and Horsemen's Park, which earned him a spot in the Nebraska Racing Hall of Fame.

Terry is also in the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame for having called a record setting 20,191 consecutive races at Oaklawn. He worked at Oaklawn for 42 years, from 1975 until his final retirement at the end of 2017. After retiring from announcing duties on January 28 2011. Terry continued working at Oaklawn as a handicapper and ambassador. January 28, 2011 was proclaimed "Terry Wallace Day" by the mayor of Hot Springs. Governor Mike Beebe and President Bill Clinton wrote him letters of congratulations. His voice was familiar to racing fans throughout the country. Terry's excited commentary often had racing fans out of their seats and waving their programs. Terry was a man very generous with his time when it came to grandchildren or charity. He served on the boards of several local charities, including the Garland County chapter of the America Cancer Society and their Leadership Council. He worked with the United Way, which has the "Terry Wallace Volunteer Award", an award that is bestowed upon the volunteer who has gone above and beyond, as Terry often did. Terry's voice will be missed everyday by his wife, Alice; children Ernest (Christine) Wallace, Jake Wallace, Sarah Wallace; grandchildren, sister, nieces and nephews, along with Alice's children and grandchildren, that he treated as his own. He will be missed.

ARKANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY EQUINE CENTER in Jonesboro, has an expanding equine program. Their facility grew from a single barn in November 2000 to a covered arena with adjacent pastures. The entire complex now covers 40 acres and houses a 52 stall barn with all major amenities including stalls, tack rooms, spacious wash racks, a 300' x 165' covered arena, bleachers, sound system, plus an outdoor arena and round pen. They stand a stallion, Rascal Cat. They have broodmares, their first foals were foals of 2018 and are registered Arkansas-breds, and they are anxiously awaiting the foaling season of 2019. As part of the curriculum of the equine program, under the direction and leadership of Dr. William McGuire, DVM, his students learn all aspects of horsemanship, owning and caring for a stallion, broodmares, breeding, foaling, raising, and selling thoroughbreds.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING
OF
THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP
OF

ARKANSAS THOROUGHBRED BREEDERS' & HORSEMEN'S ASSOCIATION

The annual meeting of the General Membership of ATBHA was held Friday, March 30, 2018 at The Clarion on the Lake, Hot Springs, AR.

President Bill McDowell presided over the meeting. The meeting was called to order.

President McDowell stated that the minutes from the previous meeting were distributed to members prior to the meeting beginning. He asked if there were any questions, corrections or discussion regarding the Minutes as published. There being none, Susan Bunn made a motion to approve the minutes as written, seconded by David Bunn. A vote was taken, Motion passed unanimously.

President McDowell began by saying he was pleased that the incentive awards paid in 2018 on the 2017 Arkansas-bred earnings showed increases again in all three categories.

He then informed the members that the Board of Directors voted to continue the incentive purse supplements to the owner of registered Arkansas-breds who finish 1st, 2nd and 3rd in open company races at Oaklawn Park during the 2018 live meet. He explained that this supplement is in addition to the owner's share of the purse money and is paid by ATBHA out of the Purse & Awards Fund, but excludes stakes races. He stated that through the previous Sunday (3/25/18) there had been seven 1st place finishes, nine 2nd place finishes and five 3rd place finishes for a total amount of \$51,000 paid through that date.

Additionally, the Board of Directors changed the payout schedule of the Rainbow and Rainbow Miss for 2018 whereby 7th through last place finishers would be paid 1% of the purse or \$1,000 to offset most of the enter and start fees paid for those two races, with the remaining purse paid out 60% to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fourth and 2% to sixth. He said that could possibly be a consideration for the other stakes if it was something that the members wanted.

He asked if anyone had any questions or wanted to discuss anything further.

There being nothing further, President McDowell announced that the General Membership Meeting was concluded, that Mr. Jesse Ullery would be our featured guest speaker and we would proceed with the program portion of the evening.

that were foaled in 2018 or thereafter have a digital tattoo prior to entry in a race.

"With modern technology, specifically the use of microchips, scanners, wireless technology and tablets, a digital tattoo will clearly provide a superior and more robust form of identification,"

Linnell said. "We want the industry at large, as well as regulators and horse identification officials, not only to be aware of the impending change but to be fully prepared for implementation of the digital tattoo by January 1, 2020."

The transition to the TRPB Digital Tattoo follows the recent requirement by The Jockey Club for a horse to be microchipped prior to being registered and, more recently, the availability of a digital certificate of foal registration. The breed registry for Thoroughbreds in North America issued the first digital foal certificate in May.

The software for the digital tattoo was developed by The Jockey Club Technology Services.

"The TRPB's Digital Tattoos are an ideal complement to The Jockey Club's microchip and digital certificate initiatives," said Rick Bailey, The Jockey Club registrar. "We are working closely with the TRPB to ensure that the horse identification system in place in for Thoroughbred racehorses in the U.S. and Canada is thorough as well as technologically advanced."

In essence, the digital tattoo is an electronic validation of the identity of a horse performed by a trained TRPB technician. The technician will use a scanner to read the horse's microchip and the microchip number will hyperlink to electronic registration information.

After fully examining the markings and foal photos contained in the horse's electronic record, the technician will confirm the identity of the horse standing in front of him or her and upload a selection of digital pictures documenting the horse's markings to The Jockey Club's database. The TRPB technician will then place an electronic embossment on the face photo of the horse and a digital stamp on the electronic certificate of registration.

This digital tattoo will indicate that the TRPB has verified the identity of the horse and uploaded updated digital photographs to the breed registry's database.

TRPB personnel will be meeting with racing officials, regulators, horse identification personnel and various other industry officials through the end of this year and throughout next year to familiarize them with the change. The current practice of branding horses on the inside lip will be discontinued at the end of 2019.

The TRPB website will contain additional information leading up to the rollout of the digital tattoo.

The TRPB, based in Fair Hill, Maryland, is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations of North America and serves as a national investigative agency in the horse racing industry with the goal of maintaining public confidence in the sport of Thoroughbred racing.

A Message from our President:

Don't forget, Arkansas register your new brood mares before they foal. ATBHA Board members that live close to farms that we are not familiar with will be checking on mare's locations. Hopefully this will deter any would-be cheating against the ATBHA.

Registered Arkansas-breds earned \$900,000 more in 2018 than in 2017. This is mainly because of the purse increases at Oaklawn, we're breeding better horses and there are probably a few more starters. The larger earnings and about the same amount of funds in the Purse & Awards Fund as we had last year will drop Breeder's awards a little over one percent (1%). We will be paying somewhere around 13.6%. We are still doing well and look to be secure with Oaklawn's growth of casinos and the hotel.

It's nice to walk on solid ground this past week. It's been muddy all winter and we've had a little itch fungus on a few horses because of that.

It's February 7th. I wrote out the above before today and I guess I spoke to soon as it's raining pretty hard right now. Temperatures dropped from 70 degrees last night to a low tomorrow of 28 degrees. This weather is tough on the animals.

Hope you have a good Oaklawn meet!

FROM THE ATBHA OFFICE

Hopefully all foal registrations were submitted for 2018 foals before the 12/31/18 weanling registration deadline. If not, you now have a yearling that wasn't timely registered. The yearling rate is \$200, if the mare is already registered. If not, the Mare Registration is \$500 in addition to the foal's fee. I believe our new Broodmare registration rules will alleviate most of the late and higher Broodmare registration fees from occurring.

As a reminder ... Registration of a Broodmare ... Pursuant to ATBHA Rules & Regulations, ALL Broodmare registrations MUST BE MADE WHEN THE MARE IS BROUGHT INTO ARKANSAS, PRIOR TO THE FOALING DATE. If you buy a mare out of state, at a sale or from an individual, the mare MUST BE REGISTERED WITH ATBHA WHEN THE MARE IS BROUGHT INTO ARKANSAS, PRIOR TO FOALING. If you are a new member and are bringing a mare in from another state, the MARE MUST BE REGISTERED WHEN SHE IS BROUGHT INTO ARKANSAS, BEFORE FOALING. If you are an existing member and desire to retire a racing filly or mare and put her into the breeding program, you MUST REGISTER HER AS A BROODMARE WITH THE ATBHA, PRIOR TO HER FOALING DATE. **IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING ANY PART OF THIS RULE OR ANY OTHER RULE, PLEASE CONTACT THE ATBHA OFFICE FOR CLARIFICATION.**

2019 IS AN ELECTION YEAR. Ballots for the eleven positions on the ATBHA Board of Directors will be mailed to ATBHA members by March 4, 2019. 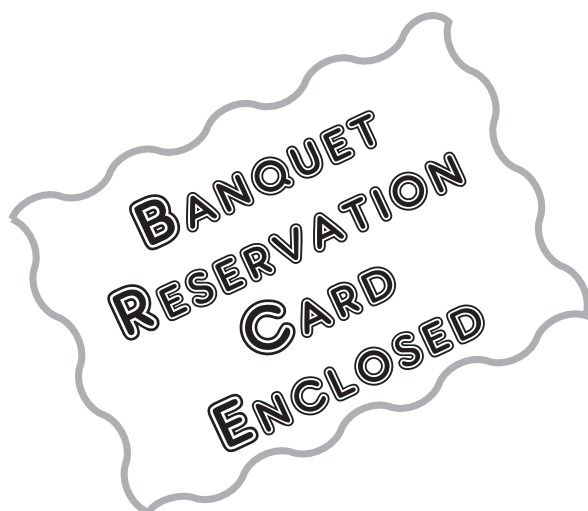
